This team led by the newly named Captain Gary Enright were very pleased by the overall performance as were their management Gerry Molyneaux and Pat O'Donnell. After playing against the wind in the opening 30 minutes, the score at half-time showed St. Mary's 0:9 while Adare had 0:4. The second half was also exciting with the final score showing a very creditable score of 0:17 for St. Marys to the 0:09 scored by Adare. Shane Hourigan was in fine form throught scoring 9 points in all including 4 from play. We believe that this is the first time in ages that we have had a team in the A-Grade at under-21 and for them to record a win in their opening game was a tremendous boost.

The winners of the three first round games now progress to the semi-finals while the losers will play off for the remaining semi-final spot. Our lads have earned a semi-final spot alongside Feenagh/Kilmeedy and Newcastlewest who recorded wins as follows: Feenagh/Kilmeedy 0-15, Knockaderry 0-08.
