
The "Save Africa" fund is managed by I.F.A., I.C.M.S.A. and I.C.A. and all monies go to help the rural poor of Africa.

Rathkeale Boys to Represent Limerick in U11 Project in the National Finals

We are four boys from Rathkeale who will represent County Limerick in the Under 11¢s Project at the National Finals of the Community Games in Athlone this May. Our names are Jack Fahy, Mark White, Barry Coleman and Sean Malone and the project we are doing is called õDoes Sport Encourage Fair Play or Foul Play?ö As a part of the project we looked at what is fair play and foul play. We considered the impact of being involved in sport. We did this by handing out questions to all the boys in our school. We investigated the need to win at all costs including cheating. We looked at the importance of taking part in sport for all members of our community including the Special Olympics which will take place in Limerick this June. We checked out what is meant by self regulation within sport, like kicking about the ball with your friends no referees just us. We examined Thierry Henry s hand passing of the ball and the finishing Ireland work cup dreams.

We interviewed sporting people in our community such as Shane Hourigan our local GAA referee, Patrick Sheahan member of our Munster Junior B Hurling Champions



Team who also trains us in hurling at school every Friday, our teacher and Limerick County football player Tommy Stack, Keith Hartnett who is on the International Junior Football team and our soccer coach, Joe Williams of the local boxing club, Tara Coleman, Barryøs sister who is an all Ireland champion at running and Órla Fahy, Jackøs sister who will represent Limerick in the Community Games inAugust at under 8 swimming freestyle.

We wrote to all the local clubs including GAA, soccer, athletics, boxing and community games wondering if their club would think about giving a Fair Play Award at their Awards Night. We think that it would be really important to give a prize like this to the person who shows fair play when taking part in either training or events.

After all the work we put into the project we think that fair play is best, foul play and cheating do not pay. Cheats will always be found out no matter what. Sport is fun and good for you. The newspapers and TV love foul play as it sells papers and gets more people watching. The GAA have introduced a system for giving points for fair play in the National Football League this is known as the Fair Play Index, Limerick have the most points for fair play. As the Community Games Pledge says; we will take part in the games in a friendly rivalry and be honest and that we wonot aim for victory at any price, we will unite our community in a friendly sporting competition, competing fairly and honestly and attempt to make Rathkeale a happier place to live.

This national competition is designed to find two major proposals that, when implemented, will transform our economy – or significant elements of it – by creating jobs and opportunity. The competition, therefore, has two phases. Phase 1 is to find winning proposals and Phase 2 is all about implementation.

Phase One

So that the Judges can decide in Phase 1 whether a proposal wins or not they have to be able to understand clearly what the proposal is all about. The Judges will be looking specifically for:

- 1. The degree of fresh thinking and creativity that has been applied in building the proposal.
- 2. The scale of what is being proposed does it have the possibility of generating significant employment opportunities?
- 3. A convincing case for implementation do we have the resources (financial, human, technical, infrastructural....) or could we get them? what barriers need to be overcome? how long is implementation likely to take?

Addressing these areas comprehensively -and better than anyone else -is what it takes to win one of the two €100,000 prizes. Proposals might involve new models for doing business or delivering services, or they may identify a completely new industry, type of business or service, or a new way of developing or expanding an existing industry, business or service.

Phase Two

Implementation will commence before the end of the year 2010. Winning proposals may require legislative, administrative or procedural change before implementation can be effected. This will be part of the task of the implementation phase of the competition. The Promoters of the competition will have the services of a pro-bono professional advisory group, including representatives from key government departments, and up to €1 million of a development fund to implement the two winning proposals i.e. €500,000 each. This competition is not about creating new products. It's about creating something that will have a long-term positive impact on the Irish economy. "Your Country, Your Call" is all about Ireland.
